Job description:

Plasterers finish interior walls and ceilings of residential and commercial buildings, apply plaster on masonry, metal and wire lath or gypsum. They also apply cement on masonry, metal and wire lath (stucco). Most of these finishes are applied by hand.

Minimum Qualifications

- 1. 18 years of age**
- 2. High School diploma or GED equivalent**

Note: Applicants must submit non-returnable proof of age, high school transcripts or GED certificate with the application.

Employers may require valid driver's license & drug testing.
