Making a Pinch Pot

• STEPS:

- 1. Create a spherical 'Ball' form out of your clay
- 2. Use a firm thumb to press an opening into the ball
- 3. Gently press with your thumb on the inside and a couple fingers on the outside and slowly rotate the clay in one direction
- 4. Start with a symmetrical, even form and then shape
- 5. Add subtractive and additive texture

• TIPS FOR SUCCESS:

- Make the walls thinner GRADUALLY,
- Use <u>gentle pressure</u> and really FEEL what the clay is doing in between your thumb and fingers. Shut your eyes occasionally to fully access your sense of feel
- Do not use water- Accept when your clay is cracking severely. In this case use a water container and dip one finger into the water and then work into the clay
- To smooth cracks gently press the clay across the crack with firm pressure

Clean Up:

- Wrap your clay in plastic (I have brought sandwich bags for your pinch pots) Air Tight to prevent drying!
- Wipe your ware board! (all clay bits in clay recycle bin or garbage- Not the Floor!) Remove all clay before wiping with a damp sponge
- Clean and put away all tools, water containers, etc
- Wipe your table area with a clean damp sponge
- All messy clay tools/water containers, hands get rinsed over the clay buckets in the sink.

Textured Pinch Pots





- Create 2 pots that are a similar size and shape with <u>even and consistent walls</u>
- Refine the inside surface and lip to make the clay very smooth
- Develop a <u>subtractive</u> and <u>additive</u> texture pattern around the outside of your bowl:
 - Press the clay with stamps or tools when it is plastic
 - Carve the clay with trimming/wire loop tools when it is leather hard

Studio Clean UP

- Everyone works collaboratively to complete assigned clean up task:
 - <u>Sink:</u> Wipe down and organize- make sure no clay is in the bottom of the sink, make sure clay bucket lids are in place, put away any tools that were left out
 - Tools: organize and clean tools on tool shelf
 - <u>Canvas table tops:</u> Scrape all clay bits into clay recycle and spray lightly with spray bottle
 - Tables: wipe down with clean sponges, and dry
 - Ware Boards: organize and wipe down if necessary
 - <u>Water containers:</u> rinse, make sure no clay residue is left behind and organize in dish drainer
 - <u>Slip Containers on canvas table tops:</u> mix new slip, make sure lids are secured
 - <u>Glaze Area</u>: organize glazes, brushes, and mixing tools (make sure all are clean and put away) Empty glaze water buckets (solids in garbage can) and refill, wipe down counter and table area
