Rules of Facial Proportion:

- a. Eyes rest along the horizontal axis of the head (divides top of head to chin in half)
- b. 5 Eye widths fit across the head along the horizontal axis
- c. Length of nose is one and a half eye widths long (from horizontal axis line to bottom of nose) (For a child it is one eye width)
- d. Nostrils line up with inner corner of eyes
- e. Middle mouth line is $\frac{1}{3}$ rd the distance from bottom of nose to chin
- f. Corners of mouth align with middle of eyes
- g. Top of ear aligns with eyebrows
- h. Bottom of ear aligns with bottom of nose

Vertical Axis

b. 5 eye widths fit across horizontal axis

c. Length of nose =
1 1/2 eye widths

g. Ear lines up with eyebrow and bottom of nose

a. Horizontal Axis

e. Middle mouth line is 1/3 rd of the way down from bottom of nose

d. Nostrils line up with corner of eye

f. Corner of mouth lines up with middle of eye

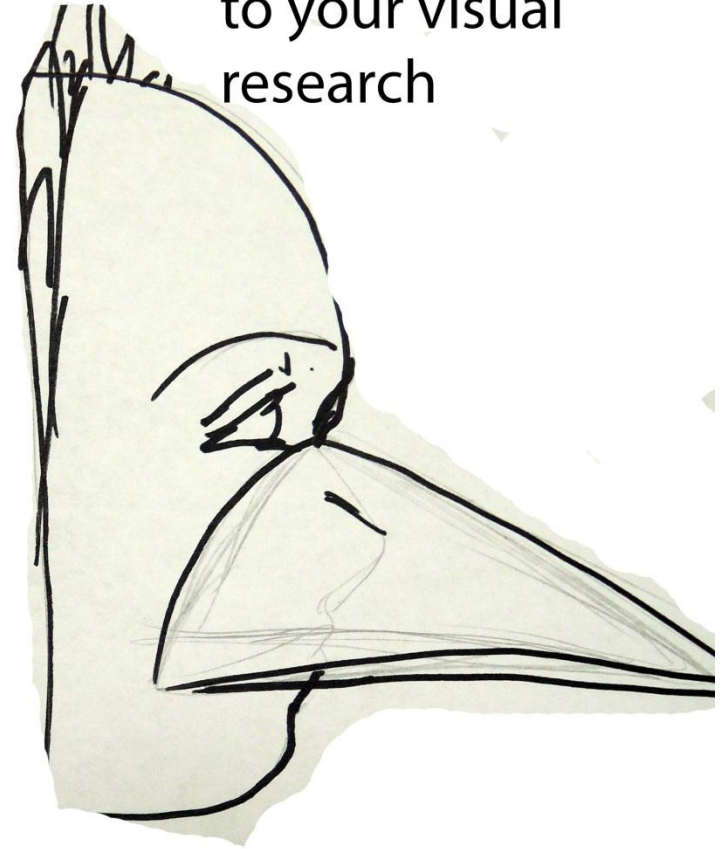
