
Painting Practice

- What places and environments have significance to you? How can you represent your connection to these places through paint? Collect a variety of visual research and value thumbnail studies from life to practice and explore a variety of compositions.
- Level 2- Create 3 thumbnail studies of spaces/places that you spend a lot of time in- 1 indoor, 1 outdoor, and 1 imaginary
- Level 3- Create 5 thumbnail studies of spaces/places that you spend a lot of time in- 2 indoor and 2 outdoor and one imaginary
- Create 3 practice paintings: Each practicing a different technique and with a different dominant color scheme.

Value Study Criteria:

- Make and use a view finder to help in 'finding' compositions you find interesting in the space around you
- Focus on basic shapes- develop foreground/back/middle
- Use a full value scale in assigning shapes' value- Loosly!
- What's next?
 - You will be creating 3 painting practice compositions to develop craft, demonstrate learning of technique and style, as well as composition.
- What's next after that?
 - You will design a painting of your choice- focused on space/environment with foreground, middle ground/background, using chosen favorite technique and style applications from your practice
 - Level 3- will stretch your own canvas
