<u>Creative Problem:</u> Create a collage inspired by the changing of the seasons: Consider the following questions:

Project Criteria:

Imagery: All your imagery should be a response to one or more of the questions listed above, and work together to help visually communicate you ideas.

- Incorporate a contour line drawing of a Fall object
- Incorporate a digital photograph of a Fall object/s
- Scan in found paper/textures: (lined notebook paper, newspaper, wrinkled paper bag etc.)

Design: Elements and Principles Arrange your chosen imagery in such a way that you create:
